

Dear Members of the Advent Family, Concert Series Patrons, and Attendees,

As always, we are grateful to God for the gift of music, the provision of this Cathedral Concert Series, and the opportunity to present internationally renowned artists in concerts of sacred music here in Birmingham, Alabama.

The 2025-2026 season will be a mix of both new and familiar. **Polyphony**, "one of the best small choirs now before the public" (*The Telegraph*), will start our season with a concert here on Thursday, October 16, directed by Stephen Layton, who held a long tenure as Fellow and Director of Music at Trinity College, Cambridge. **VOCES8** needs no introduction at the

Advent, and we are honored to present them once again on our Concert Series on Thursday, February 12. A work that is well-known but new to the Advent in recent history is Benjamin Britten's celebrated *A Ceremony of Carols* that will precede our annual Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols, and I am very excited about performing this work in this context. The annual Holy Week Meditation on Palm Sunday has returned, this time with something new and a Birmingham premiere: *Via Crucis*, a meditative service that combines prayers of Eric Milner-White and music of Philip Moore. Last on the Concert Series is our very own **Cathedral Choir** offering a concert of music they will sing for their upcoming residencies in England.

In recent years we have invited notable church musicians to guest conduct our Cathedral Choir, and this year I am honored to have **Walden Moore** joining us in March to lead Evensong. Recently retired after forty years of leading the landmark music ministry of Trinity Church on the Green in New Haven, Walden Moore is one of America's celebrated church choral trainers and musicians. Moreover, his coming here is very special for me personally, as I served as an Organ Scholar under him during my graduate studies and remain immensely grateful for all the knowledge and wisdom I gained from him.

I cordially invite you to these and all of our events found in this brochure. Please join me in thanking our Concert Series Patrons, whose generosity makes the Cathedral Concert Series possible. I also want to thank you all for your interest and support, and for keeping a love for sacred music alive in the city of Birmingham.

Though not even a century old, Benjamin Britten's A Ceremony of Carols, Op. 28 composed in 1942 has become a Christmas musical tradition for choirs all around the world. Scored for threepart treble choir and harp, it marries older texts - mainly Middle English and Latin - with music of a modern yet timeless character. The sopranos and altos of the Cathedral Choir, along with guest harpist Diedre Henson Agustin and conducted by our Director of Music and Liturgy, present this work for the first time as an extended prelude to our annual Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols.

The Cathedral Church of the Advent welcomes **Walden Moore** to lead this special service of Choral Evensong in Lent. For forty years, Mr. Moore served as Organist and Choirmaster of Trinity Church on the Green in New Haven, Connecticut, where he led the Choir of

Men and Boys, one of the oldest such choirs of the Anglican Choral Tradition in the United States, and founded the Choir of Men and Girls. Throughout his tenure there, he trained and mentored numerous organ scholars, many of whom have gone on to serve in prominent church positions across the country. Now retired from Trinity, he continues to teach service playing at the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music.


