A Word from the Vice Dean



Luke chapter 18 begins with an intriguing little parable. The judge in the story is pretty much a secular scoundrel who, we're told, "neither feared God nor regarded man."

And there is a widow who wouldn't leave him alone, saying, "vindicate me against my adversary." (Because she's a widow, we're left to believe that she lacks resources and political pull.)

But what she lacks in external influence she makes up with that all-so-important personal characteristic – persistence! She simply won't take no for an answer. She pesters the judge to the point that he finally says (in effect), "Oh, alright already! Lest you wear me out, I will grant you justice." That's the parable.

Now, to be sure, Jesus isn't likening God to the unrighteous judge. It's one of those "how much more" parables. Meaning, if a wicked judge will sometimes respond to do good (even with a bad motive), then how

much more will a righteous God respond to those who cry out to him?

Have you been waiting on God to answer your prayers? If so, don't give up! Ask, and keep on asking. He hears. He knows. He loves. He answers. Not always exactly as we think we want (thank God for that!), but God always answers our prayers. We need only to believe that he alone knows what is best

In fact, as far as our prayer life is concerned, isn't that our ultimate hope – that God knows best? As Jesus taught us to pray, "Thy will be done." Not that God will do as we ask (when we ask it), but that God, who is "wont to give more than either we desire or deserve" (to quote that great Anglican prayer), will always do what is best for us.

At the beginning of this parable, it says that Jesus told it so they would pray, and not lose heart. Maybe the real question for us to consider is: Where do we place our hope? Is it in our prayers being answered in our way, and in our time? Or is our hope in the One to whom we are praying?

Through residential recovery and aftercare programs averaging 9-12 months, they offer housing, food, clothing, healthcare, counseling, life-skills training, job readiness, education, and childcare with the ultimate goal of providing tools each woman needs to support herself, parent her children, break cycles of incarceration and poverty, and re-enter society as contributing women of God.

Sex Education

For 5th and 6th Graders, and Parents

We live in a world that constantly talks about and references sex – often in ways that don't reflect God's design. Our hope is that the church and home can be the places where our children hear the truth.

On Saturday, November 15, from 9:00–11:00 a.m., the Advent will host *The Bible Talks About THAT?!* – our annual sex education course for 5th and 6th graders and their parents.

The program will begin in the Refectory with children and parents together for a brief welcome. Afterward, children will dismiss to their sessions on God's good design of the body, male and female puberty, and sex.

- •Boys will meet with Dean Pinter and 6th-grade Sunday School teacher, Dr. Robert Green, MD.

While children are in their sessions, parents will remain in the Refectory to hear from Margot Cooney, Tara Davis, Gil Kracke, and Will Fagan about how to talk with your children about the body and sex. We will conclude the program with children rejoining in the Refectory.

We know talking about these sex-related topics can feel awkward, but we are excited and eager to equip and support you so that you feel comfortable, competent, and confident! If you have not talked to your child about sex prior to this event, we recommend doing so and letting them know what the program is about. 
