A Word from Canon Young

Kate DiCamillo's children's book, *The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane*, is a tale about a porcelain rabbit doll given to a little girl from polite society. Through a series of un-

fortunate scenarios, Edward changes hands many times and finds himself ruined and even physically broken. He is lost at the bottom of the ocean floor, scooped up and deposited in a garbage dump, travels the railroad with a vagrant, and is brought to the simple home of a farmer and his wife, only to be stolen by a young boy who gives Edward as a gift to his ill sister before she dies.

At each stop, Edward is loved and adored by very different people. Yet this once expertly crafted porcelain figure, meant to be displayed on a high shelf away from harm, has become broken and disfigured. Each time Edward changes owners, he begins to feel the separation and loss to greater and greater degrees. This once shallow and haughty rabbit, at the outset chiefly concerned with his own self-importance, comes to discover things about himself through the trials of his travels. It is only after being finally broken into fragments and glued back together that he discovers that not only is he loved, but he had love to offer in return. His once hard heart that assumed his existence was about his own satisfaction had been softened, and this freed him to experience a new feeling: gratitude. The joy of being loved and enabled to love became a life-altering re-orientation for him.

Perhaps you can identify with this rabbit's fictional journey. You may know what it's like to be overlooked, cast aside, or discarded. You may know the sting of rejection or failure. Sometimes it is in the very recognition of our need that the grace of the gospel warms our cold and longing hearts. As we approach the holiday season that invites us to return thanks and to offer gifts, may we remember the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, "that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich."

For 5th and 6th Graders, and Parents, on November 15

We live in a world that constantly talks about and references sex – often in ways that don't reflect God's design. Our hope is that the church and home can be the places where our children hear the truth.

On Saturday, November 15, from 9:00–11:00 a.m., the Advent will host *The Bible Talks About THAT?!* – our annual sex education course for 5th and 6th graders and their parents.

The program will begin in the Refectory with children and parents together for a brief welcome. Afterward, children will dismiss to their sessions on God's good design of the body, male and female puberty, and sex.

- •Boys will meet with Dean Pinter and 6th-grade Sunday School teacher Dr. Robert Green, MD.

While children are in their sessions, parents will remain in the Refectory to hear from Margot Cooney, Tara Davis, Gil Kracke, and Will Fagan about how to talk with your children about the body and sex. We will conclude the program with children rejoining in the Refectory.

We know talking about these sex-related topics can feel awkward, but we are eager to equip and support you so that you feel comfortable, competent, and confident! If you have not talked to your child about sex prior to this event, we recommend doing so and letting them know what the program is about. 
