A Word from Will Fagan

We've reached that time of year again when the clocks fall back and the day darkens before it really even has a chance to end. I, like 99 percent of the population, mourn the loss of

one more hour of daylight and the opportunity for outdoor activity after work or school. It certainly takes getting used to finding it completely dark not long after 5:00 p.m.

Yet, I've found since becoming a father, I don't mind it as much. While we would say that the season of Advent is our "official" time to prepare our hearts for Christmas, I have found this time change starts that process for me, particularly seeing the world through my young daughters' eyes.

As we drive home from their school, the sun setting or fully set, soon we'll see workmen begin to light the town's trees on the way to our street, much to their delight. When we get home, we might light a fire, both of which strike the "changing of the season" feeling and the march toward the holidays. (Don't tell anyone that I'll begin

listening to King's College Lessons & Carols, too.)

And I hear you, I'm reinforcing the fact that these days we seem to just jump over Thanksgiving and into Christmas. While that's not altogether great, I think there's a reason for that.

In a world gone increasingly busy, angry, anxious, and sad, I think a lot of what we're after on a societal level is something *good* to look forward to. And really that's true, because in the ins and outs and ups and downs of our lives, we personally want something to look forward to – we want good news that feels like good news. At some level, we're always after that feeling of what it's like when we put the string lights on the tree.


