## A Word from Canon Gardner

Years ago my wife and I attended a church that had an extended moment of silence at each Sunday service. The minister would read the words from Psalm 46:10, "Be

still and know that I am God," and this would lead into a quiet time set aside for each congregant to personally encounter God. It was only a minute long, but I always loved this portion of the service. It was a holy pause. Sometimes I was moved to silently pray. Other times I just reflected on God's character. Admittedly, many times my mind wandered into to-do lists and lunch plans. But in any case, I loved the weekly experience of being still.

Our modern lives are so terribly hurried and stressful. Everything is rushed these days: two-day shipping (or less!); messages received via text that demand an immediate answer; too many projects on our plates to give appropriate attention to any one of them – just get it done quickly and move to the next one; appointment after

appointment after appointment. This is the normal, everyday buzz of stress that we all experience. It is like a persistent headache that just will not go away.

Once I heard of a minister who would go out on painstakingly slow walks when his calendar would be too full and time demands were causing unmanageable stress. When life was moving too fast, he would walk at a snail's pace. This practice allowed him to listen to God's still, small voice.

I have not tried the painstakingly slow pace myself, but I do find that walking outside, no matter the weather, is a way that allows me to experience God's grace too. When life feels chaotic, a walk with the Lord gives me reassurance that he is working all things out. He does not need my half-baked efforts. He has it. He has me. The Gospel tune, "Just a Closer Walk with Thee" expresses it well: "I am weak, but Thou art strong. Jesus keep me from all wrong. I'll be satisfied as long as I walk, Dear Lord, close to thee."


