THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO ST. MATTHEW.

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible;



The Choir sings Philip Doddridge's text *Hark the Glad Sound!* to the hymn tune *Bristol* as the Offertory anthem this morning. The music was composed by Thomas Ravenscroft (c. 1588-1635) for a setting of Psalm 64 in the 1621 *The Whole Booke of Psalmes*, which he compiled and published while living in Bristol. As was often the case in Psalm settings of the period, the melody is sung in the tenor voice, and in the manuscript the tenor line is labeled "Bristoll Tune". The Choir will sing the third stanza of the hymn in this manner, while the rest of the hymn will be sung as the tune *Bristol* is commonly published in hymnals.



THE HOLY COMMUNION

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. **People:** And with thy spirit.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God. [A proper preface is added here.] Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; evermore praising thee, and saying,

THE PEOPLE SING:

Holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts: Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord Most High. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

THE PEOPLE KNEEL OR SIT. AS THE CELEBRANT CONTINUES WITH THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER.

All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again...

...through Jesus Christ our Lord; By whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **Amen.**

And now, as our Savior Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say,

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. THE COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

INTERCESSORY PRAYER IS AVAILABLE IN THE REAR OF THE NAVE.

All baptized Christians are warmly invited to receive Communion. You may receive at the rail or the station. If you prefer not to receive the wine, simply cross your arms across your chest after receiving the bread. To receive the wine, you may drink from the cup or dip the bread in the small vessel inside the cup. (If you are not baptized but would like to be, please see one of the ministers following the service.)

Refrain: Pour down, O heavens, from above, and let the skies rain down righteousness.

Turn your fierce anger from us, O Lord, and remember not our sins for ever. Your holy cities have become a desert, Zion a wilderness, Jerusalem a desolation; our holy and beautiful house, where our fathers praised you. *Refrain*

We have sinned and become like one who is unclean; we have all withered like a leaf, and our iniquities like the wind have swept us away. You have hidden your face from us, and abandoned us to our iniquities. *Refrain*

You are my witnesses, says the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen, that you may know me and believe me. I myself am the Lord, and none but I can deliver; what my hand holds, none can snatch away. *Refrain*

Comfort my people, comfort them; my salvation shall not be delayed.

I have swept your offences away like a cloud; fear not, for I will save you.

The Latin chant Rorate caeli (*Pour Down, O Heavens From Above*) has been translated into English in several forms, and has become known as the *Advent Prose*. The first lines come from Isaiah 45:8, and the rest of the text speaks to our waiting and need for the Savior.
