A Word from Canon Pinter

In 1991 I was browsing a bookshop in Vancouver, British Columbia, when a musical piece began playing. It was simple, yet profound. Just two instruments played – a piano

and a violin – and it felt like they were talking to one another. I had never heard it before, but I stood there transfixed for almost 10 minutes.

The piece is called *Spiegel im Spiegel* by Estonian composer Arvo Pärt, who recently celebrated his 90th birthday. Pärt was born shortly before his country was invaded by the Nazis in World War II and then subsequently annexed by the Soviet Union. He came from a broken family, but he was consoled by music. When he was a boy, every Friday he would ride his bicycle around the town square while a weekly concert played over the public speakers.

He began playing music early in life and by his 40s was one of the Soviet Union's most acclaimed composers. After becoming a Christian in the 1970s, Pärt (in quiet defiance of the Soviet Union's aggressively atheistic stance) based most of his music, whether instrumental or choral, on biblical or liturgical texts. As a result, in 1980 he and his family were expelled from Estonia, living in Vienna and Berlin before eventually returning to their homeland after the collapse of the USSR.

Today, Pärt is regarded by many as one of the world's greatest living composers. Distinctive to his work is the importance of silence. He uses silence (to quote Dr. Charles Kennedy) to create energy in his music, as demonstrated powerfully in pieces like "The Deer's Cry," St. Patrick's Breastplate Prayer set to music.

I think Pärt's music is prayer. He has been one of the greatest teachers in prayer to me, helping me to listen for God's voice, especially in the midst of silence and quiet. As in his music, silence in prayer creates energy so that we can reply to God, powerfully, through the Holy Spirit. This Advent, may the energy of silence aid your prayer as we wait together.

Christmas Hope from The Twilight Zone

PZ to Present Part 2 of His Series December 11

Dean Emeritus Paul Zahl wrote the following about his series "Christmas Hope from The Twilight Zone."

Rod Serling was born on December 25, 1924. Although he came from a secular Jewish background in upstate New York, he felt "imprinted" – in a good way – by his date of birth. He returned often – I mean, like 12 times – to a Christmas setting for his TV scripts throughout a long career.

One of the best of these, in my opinion, is "The Messiah on Mott Street" (1969), starring Edward G. Robinson (photo right, from the episode), made for Serling's series Night Gallery.

I will show this episode on Thursday evening, December 11, 7:00 p.m. at Cranmer House in Homewood (2814 Linden Avenue, 35209).

Maybe you know the episode already, maybe it's new to you. It is a poignant supernatural masterpiece, carrying the Christmas Hope like a hidden jewel box.



Also, "The Messiah on Mott Street" is IMO the zenith of Jewish-Christian assimilation in mainstream network history. There's been nothing like it before or since.

Britten's 1942 composition has become a musical tradition for choirs all around the world. It marries older texts – mainly Middle English and Latin – with music of a modern yet timeless character. 
