A Word from the Vice Dean

I once saw a really cheesy magnet with an image of Jesus, standing with outstretched arms above the words, "Jesus is coming look busy!" It was, of course, meant to be

funny, but very likely also revealed a misguided underlying theology which would encourage the need for us to do something in order to repair whatever might be broken in our relationship with God.

During this season of Advent, there is indeed much talk and prayer about "preparing our hearts" for the coming of Jesus, and also about our "being ready" for Christ's return, which we're told will happen at an unexpected hour. So, how do we go about preparing our hearts and getting ourselves ready, if not by just "looking busy"? To which we turn to the apostle Paul!

The staff has recently been studying Paul's letter to the Galatian Church, and when describing the transformation that happens within the life of the believer, he advises that we "put on" the Lord Jesus

Christ.

Christ. He says, "for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (3:27, NIV). This is actually a recurring theme throughout Paul's letters, and the entire Bible.

Beginning in Genesis, after the fall of Adam and Eve (when their eyes were opened to realizing they were naked), it says, "The Lord God made for Adam and his wife garments of skins, and clothed them." Which is to say, the garments hid their shame, and were a sign of God's grace.

Later the Psalmist talks about God's priests being "clothed with righteousness," as well as Isaiah who describes God clothing him with "a robe of righteousness." When the Prodigal Son returns home, he is given the best clothing as a sign of his renewed sonship, and there are other examples. Suffice it to say that, in the Bible, clothing often points toward God's grace and a new beginning, and it's always a gift.

So, we know neither the day nor the hour when he will return. Are you ready? What are you wearing? Clothe yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ!

Traditional Service to Follow Benjamin Britten's "A Ceremony of Carols" December 18

On Thursday, December 18, at 6:00 p.m. in the Nave, the Cathedral Choir will offer A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols, modeled after the service held annually at King's College, Cambridge. The Christmas narrative is told through Scripture and song – a wonderful way to celebrate the Advent and Christmas seasons. During the service, a new arrangement of the carol *Thus Angels Sung*, commissioned by the St. Cecilia Fund of the Cathedral Church of the Advent and composed by Philip Moore, will receive its world premiere.

At 5:30 p.m., preceding the service, the women of the choir will sing Benjamin Britten's *A Ceremony of Carols* accompanied by Diedre Agustin on the harp and conducted by Fred Teardo as an extended prelude. Britten's 1942 composition has become a musical tradition for choirs all around the world. It marries older texts – mainly Middle English and Latin – with music of a modern yet timeless character.

Whether you are on your way home from working downtown, or simply looking for an opportunity to hear some festive seasonal music and the gospel, you are all warmly invited to join us for this weeknight service.


