A Word from Canon Young

Familiarity breeds contempt. Or so the saying goes. I think about our cultural Christmas season and wonder what is going on in the hearts and minds of people as we frantically shop and

fill our calendars with events in anticipation of the season. I become aware of how busy and full December feels. I wonder what spiritually is happening to me, to us, when we are bombarded by the commercialized and sanitized energy of cultural Christmas. What apathy has ensnared my heart? What groove has become so worn in my soul that the Nativity is either a sweet saccharine memento or, even worse, background decor for my otherwise interesting lifestyle?

My family watched the delightful movie, The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, and it was jarring to see myself in some of the film's characters. It's a parable of sorts of just how incredibly powerful and beautiful the gospel story really is – the wonder of Christ coming among us. It depicts a family of hooligan children who take part in the annual Christmas pageant, much to the chagrin of some of the well-mannered church folk. The Herdman children were rowdy, crass, and unkempt. Their surprising presence in the pageant had people anticipating the worst.

The oldest sister, Emma Jean, plays Mary in the pageant, and is seen weeping silently over the baby-doll Jesus. The narrator relates what happens in a pivotal scene as the unruly Emma Jean "had caught on to the idea of God and the wonder of Christmas... Christmas just came over her all at once, like a case of chills and fever." The pageant's audience, previously skeptical of the Herdman's participation in a sacred church event, watched in awe as the fresh and tender message of the Incarnation washed over her, moving her to tears. There's something alluring and delightful about how beautiful the story of Christmas is for a weary world like ours.

Martin Luther wrote, "All praise to Thee, eternal God, who, clothed in garb of flesh and blood, dost take a manger for Thy throne, while worlds on worlds are thine alone." May the wonder of the babe in the manger once more draw us more deeply into faith in God's saving power.

And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. - Luke 2:16-17


