

A Word from Will Fagan

What does the gos-

We often talk about this term - that is, the gospel - which is translated to good news. But we know that it's not "all talk"

because good news quite often feels like joyous, good news. That is, we're not making this stuff up.

The truth is that we know what good news feels like. What was it like, for instance, when you got the email you'd been waiting for or the letter in the mail? What was it like when the phone call came that made your heart flip?

Good news, of course, takes a front-row seat in the birth narrative of Jesus, the angels telling the shepherds, who are scared out of their skin, "Fear not, for behold I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

I love how the angels themselves clarify that the good news is one of great joy, not

of rotten luck. ("No I mean it; we're not kidding! This is good news that feels like good news!")

Perhaps most powerful of all – and we know this – is that good news of great joy usually is so good because it takes place in and around bad or uncertain news.

I hope and pray that is true for you this year, in whatever the circumstances you find yourselves. Because in those circumstances, in whatever those are for you, the good news that we have is found in a person, who is Christ the Lord. He has come to set in motion the redemption of our world and all the painful aspects of it, and he will come again, hopefully soon, for good.

That includes, by the way, whatever bad news that touches your life, and he isn't ambivalent about that. So this year as we celebrate his Incarnation, I hope you know that this good news isn't just for your neighbor down the street or only churchy people. The good news is a reality because Jesus came for all people, and that means you, too.




