A Word from Canon Gardner

For most of us, the magic of the holidays is behind us. Perhaps some of you reading this still have your Christmas trees up (I certainly do!), but so many put them away

by New Year's Eve. On to the next thing. Most people will return in earnest to their jobs this coming Monday, if they have not returned already. Students will return to their classrooms. Everything has been a blur. Has this been a long dream? For some perhaps it has been a nightmare. The holidays are immensely difficult for those who are grieving a loss or experiencing strife or heartache. God be merciful.

January for many marks a time of optimism, a new start. For others it is just the same old song of monotony and indifference. Where do you find yourself? Does the calendar dictate your mood and outlook? The New Year can often feel like a false reset to me. Arbitrary as it is though, we do jump back into old and new patterns alike.

I want to hold onto the magic of Christmas a little longer. I love that pause between Christmas and the New Year that is ingrained into so many of us. That pause is predicated on grace. This is the Christian life. Every year we hear those two sacred passages on the First Sunday After Christmas (last Sunday), but so few of us actually hear it. The passages are from Galatians 3 and John 1, and the focus is on how the burden of the law no longer has its hold on us; rather, the grace of Jesus Christ has set us free. This is the point of Christmas!

I have known a handful of people in my life who leave their Christmas decorations up all year. Stay close to these people. On the face of it, they may seem delusional or falsely optimistic. But they know the gospel, and they do not take themselves too seriously. We are free because of Christ. The manger and the cross are our hope and salvation. You are forgiven and free. In the words of my dear friend Jacob Smith in NYC: "Enjoy your forgiveness!"


