Election January 25



A Word from Canon Pinter

I Want to Be a Pilgrim

"Who would true valour see, let him come hither; One here will constant be, come wind, come weather. There's no discouragement shall make him once relent, his first avowed intent to be a pilgrim."

Craig reminded me of this quote from John Bunyan's *The Pilgrim's Progress* just before I left for Greece. When this article is published in the *Adventurer*, I will have just returned from a 10-day pilgrimage with fellow Adventers to Greece. I'm writing this before I leave, so it will be interesting to reflect on this after we return, whether any of my hopes for the trip were realized.

To be honest, while I've done my best to prepare for this pilgrimage, I'm not sure whether my preparations are sufficient. Still, I am intentional about this: I want to be a pilgrim and not a tourist. To me, this means more than just gathering information about ruins; it means a first-handed attentiveness to the gospel story. I want

to listen to Paul's words where they were first written and read and carry the sense of wonder and truth back with me.

I want to be a pilgrim. This includes some of the strain of travel, albeit far from what Paul and his companions experienced. I want to know what it feels like as I walk the slope up to the Areopagus (Athens), stand on the *bema* (Corinth), take steps along the *Via Egnatia* (Philippi), or feel the Mediterranean mist on my face (Crete). I want to stand at that place where holiness and weather and soil meet, that integration of the ancient and the now.

My conviction is that Christ never changes and that you and I share the same citizenship in heaven as did the first-century believers. This means that wherever we walk, either in Mountain Brook or on Mount Athos, we are "strangers and pilgrims on the earth." We are those who have met the Lord Jesus along the Way, and who still journey with him until we come to our final Home. I'm glad I get to walk some of that road with you, my fellow pilgrims.
