A Word from the Vice Dean

I'm a somewhat anxious person. Actually, I'm a more-than-somewhat anxious person. It's probably due to a combination of factors, some nature and some nurture: temperament, upbringing, personality, life experience. But for whatever reason, it really can be a struggle for me to (in the words of my kids), "just be chill."

On days of acceptance, I'm quick to reference the fact that being anxious is a sign that I care. You know, if you're completely care-free, well then maybe you just don't care. However, on days when it's really weighing me down, I'm mindful that living with constant anxiety must reveal something less-than-perfect about how I'm doing spiritually.

Listen to what the Apostle Paul wrote from a first-century Roman prison. *"Don't be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus"* (Philippians 4:6-7).

Could it really be that simple? Prayer? How might prayer change things? Well, first of all, prayer reorients our perspectives, such that we're more mindful of the bigger picture. It also reminds us that we're children of a God who cares for us. In fact, prayer connects us to the One who knows us better than we know ourselves, the One who has good plans for us, *"plans to prosper us and not harm us, plans to give us a hope and a future"* (Jeremiah 29:11).

Maybe the question isn't "What are the circumstances in my life that cause me stress, and how can I get rid of them?", but rather, "Why do I have such a need to be in control over the way my life is unfolding? Do I really think that I know better than God?"

I'll conclude with this great Epiphany prayer: "Most loving Father, whose will it is for us to give thanks for all things, to fear nothing but the loss of you, and to cast all our care on you who care for us: Preserve us from faithless fears and worldly anxieties, that no clouds of this mortal life may hide from us the light of that love which is immortal, and which you have manifested to us in your Son Jesus Christ our Lord." Amen.
