A Word from Canon Young

"He loves me when I'm guilty." That's what the young priest, Jud, tells detective Benoit Blanc in the latest *Knives Out* movie, *Wake Up, Dead Man*. It's a lightning bolt of grace from a Hollywood film that somehow accurately portrays the central heart of the gospel message with clarity. God loves me when I'm guilty. He loves me when I'm at my worst. He loves me when I've fled to other lovers for self-soothing. He loves me when I'm apathetic or misguided or wallowing in self-pity. He loves me when I throw my mini temper tantrums that life isn't working out for me the way I'd like. He loves me when I have failed to uphold my part of the agreement. He loves me when I'm unlovable.

What sets the Christian gospel message apart from pop psychology, religious systems, or any other human scheme the world has ever devised is the reality of grace. Unmerited favor. Unconditional love. The one-way love of God for sinners and sufferers like you and me. It's absurd, really, that a holy God would pursue and embrace way-

ward humanity when we have disregarded his person and character. The demands of the law stand against us in accusation, confirming our guilt and just deservedness in condemnation. Yet we have an advocate in the God-man Jesus Christ. He loves us when we are guilty and acquits us because of his sacrificial atonement on the cross.

Why, then, do I repeatedly return to efforts to seek validation on my own? Why am I so determined to attempt to cobble together enough evidence of goodness or contrition? Leaky bucket that I am, the relief of forgiveness seeps out repeatedly, and I scramble to cling to my own record, largely because it's mine. I don't like borrowing from others or feeling indebted to other people and certainly not to the God of the universe. It's an affront to my agency. It makes me vulnerable – vulnerable to the love of another. Maybe the discomfort of being loved beyond performance is what you and I most need. To be reacquainted with the profound reality that God really, actually loves us. Even (especially?) when we're guilty.


