A Word from Canon Gardner

We humans express emotions in a myriad of ways, and cultural/societal norms often condition our behaviors. But a universal human expression seems to me to be laughter.

All sorts of things make us laugh, but laughter often transcends language and cultural barriers. It really is an amazing emotional response when you think about it! Some people laugh to the point of snorting or cackling, others cry when they laugh, others contort their faces and turn red, some laughs are high-pitched or low-pitched or no-pitched (have you ever witnessed people who laugh silently because they run out of breath!?). It's all funny to me, really.

St. Paul did not mention laughter as being among the fruit of the Spirit, but I often see laughter as a clear gift from God. Joy is named among that fruit, and perhaps laughter is sometimes an outward sign of that God-given joy. What makes you laugh? Some of my favorites are *Seinfeld*, the Three Stooges, my children, and of course Dean Pinter!

I laughed (and cried) when all three of my children were born. The response was uncontrollable, spontaneous, and ecstatic. It felt right. Everything felt right in those moments. Thank you, Lord.

Doctors tell us that laughter is good for lowering stress. We have also been told that laughter is good for the soul. But laughter cannot be prescribed or forced. It has to come naturally, or perhaps even supernaturally.

Abraham and Sarah both mockingly laughed at the idea that they could have a son at their advanced age. They were laughing anxiously, cynically, and restlessly under the weight of human sin and limitations. But once God delivered his promise, and Isaac was born, they laughed joyfully and gratefully. This is what God's grace causes in us.

We do not deserve this grace or this joy, and yet God delivers. This is the gospel of grace. Jesus took on our sorrow so that we would know his joy. We as Christians can laugh in the face of sin, death, and the devil, because God's promise has the final word. We can laugh, even and perhaps especially at ourselves, because God has justified us sinners once and for all.

Lenten Preachers this Week

Bishop Curry to Open Series on Ash Wednesday

Glenda Curry was invested as the 12th Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Alabama in January 2021. She had been consecrated as Bishop Coadjutor in June 2020. Prior to her election as bishop, she served as Rector of All Saints Episcopal Church in Homewood, Alabama. Ordained in 2002, she was Rector of Epiphany Episcopal Church in Leeds, Alabama, until her move to All Saints in 2004. She currently serves as Bishop liaison to Episcopal Church Cursillo Ministries.



Prior to her call to ordained ministry, Bishop Curry worked at the University of Alabama at Birmingham's nursing school before she became Dean of Nursing at Troy University. She served as President of Troy's Montgomery campus from 1992-1999, becoming Alabama's first female president of a four-year public university. She and her husband William have two children and seven grandchildren.

Daniel Stulac to Preach Thursday and Friday

Daniel Stulac is Assistant Professor of the Old Testament at Briercrest College and Seminary in Caronport, Saskatchewan, Canada. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he worked as a campus minister and organic farmer in New Hampshire, and then as an agricultural missionary in Rwanda. He attended Princeton Theological Seminary and completed his doctoral studies in the Old Testament at Duke University in 2017.



In addition to numerous essays and articles, Dr. Stulac has published several books including the forthcoming *Worship and Waste: A Christological Companion to the Book of 2 Samuel*. He is married to Danielle, and they have two daughters.
